ITINERARY

Day 1 – Utica, NY – Woodland Farm Brewery Tour & Tasting – Dinner at Babe's at Harbor Point Arriving in Utica, NY this afternoon, visit the Woodland Farm Brewery. At Woodland, they brew beer that tastes like beer! In a world of craft beers that is more concerned with throwing the kitchen sink into every batch, they proudly brew traditional styles with a focus on lagers and barrel aging. The tap list covers all varieties from easy drinking European inspired lagers, hoppy IPAs, big malty high-octane beers, and everything in between. With a 10-barrel brewhouse, they are able to produce fresh new batches regularly. They source many of their barrels from New York State distilleries, wineries, and cooperages with several of them winning awards across New York State and the U.S.A. Besides beer, they carry a host of New York State hard ciders, wines and spirits. Enjoy a tour and tasting of some of their craft beers. Following your brewery visit, you will check into the Delta Marriott, your Utica hotel for a two (2) night stay. Dinner is included this evening at Babe's at Harbor Point. Babe's at Harbor Point is a local favorite, decorated with colorful booths, posters and neon signs, and features such Utica classics like Utica Greens, Chicken Riggies and homemade soups, homemade sauces, and fresh baked bread daily. **Meals: Dinner**





Day 2 – Adirondack Scenic Railroad – Village of Old Forge – Great Camp Sagamore – Dinner Cruise on Raquette Lake

This morning enjoy an American Hot Breakfast at the hotel. After breakfast, it is a short ride to Utica's Union Station, where you will depart for a two (2) hour ride on the **Adirondack Scenic Railroad.** Travel through remote forests, past sparkling rivers, ponds and streams into the magnificent beauty of the 6-million-acre Adirondack Wilderness. A one-way rail journey, disembark in Thendara, a small-town train platform and find your bus waiting.

Next, you will have some free time and lunch on your own in the Village of Old Forge. Stroll Main Street and see many unique gift shops including Old Forge Hardware. This long-standing staple has served as a bustling center of commerce for more than 100 years. Along with hardware, you can shop for clothing, books, fishing and camping gear, furniture, houseware, gourmet foods, kitchen gadgets, cookware and bakeware, yarn and more! Old Forge is a shopper's dream filled with woodsy gifts, rustic furniture, locally made goods, and so much more.

This afternoon, tour **Great Camp Sagamore**. The Adirondack Forest Preserve surrounds the entire 27-building Great Camp Sagamore estate owned by the Alfred Vanderbilt family from 1901-1954. This masterpiece of Adirondack architecture, was a place where America's most influential people came to take a break from the clamor of modern life. Its wood and stone buildings are the vernacular rustic architecture on which our National Park lodges were modeled.

This evening enjoy a **Dinner Cruise on Raquette Lake**, the Adirondack's largest natural lake! Enjoy breathtaking views and a four-course plated meal on the W.W. Durant. During America's "Gilded Age," Raquette Lake was the playground of the rich and famous, such as JP Morgan, Vanderbilt, Huntington, and Carnegie who built fabulous country estates in the most remote wilderness. Home of the Adirondack style of architecture, there are more Great Camps on or near Raquette Lake than anywhere else in the Adirondack Park. **Meals: Breakfast, Dinner**

Day 3 – Sonnenberg Gardens – Wine Tasting – Chef Demonstrations – Finger Lakes – Canandaigua, NY

After an American Hot Breakfast at the hotel and check-out, you will depart the Adirondacks and head south to the Finger Lakes of New York. Your first stop will be Sonnenberg Mansion and Gardens. Visiting the 50 acres of gorgeous parkland and stopping at the late 1800s Mansion at Sonnenberg Gardens, has been one of the Finger Lake's most visited and beloved tour destinations. Upon arrival here you will be greeted by walking tour guides who will personally escort you through the property. You will see some of the nine formal gardens, a stop at the Mansion and back down to the antique Lord & Burnham Greenhouse. After exploring the greenhouse, enjoy a wine tasting, and visit the gift shop.

Lunch is included today at New York Kitchen where you will enjoy a three-course lunch while sipping on a glass of wine and watching two (2) Chef demonstrations. Located in the heart of the Finger Lakes, New York Kitchen is a nonprofit organization, originating from the collaboration of Constellation Brands, Wegmans Food Markets, Rochester Institute of Technology and the New York Wine and Grape Foundation. These dynamic forces came together with a shared passion and mission to create a gateway for people around the world to experience New York's incredible agriculture and viticulture industries. New York Kitchen believes that a strong connection between people, place and produce is essential to promoting healthy lifestyles and thriving communities. Each day, New York Kitchen drives this mission forward through its educational hands-on cooking and











craft beverage pairing classes and programs, industry certification courses and 100% New York State Tasting Room.

Following lunch and the demonstrations you will have some free time to shop and explore downtown Canandaigua. There are a variety of shops in this historic district of downtown Canandaigua. Dinner is included this evening in a local restaurant. Following dinner, you will check into your hotel, the Holiday Inn Express in Canandaigua, New York. **Meals: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner**

Day 4 – Naples, NY – Artizanns – Arbor Hill Grapery & Winery

After breakfast at the hotel and check-out, we will depart Canandaigua and head towards Naples, NY. Just north of Naples we will stop at Artizanns, a unique shop featuring the work of over 200 Finger Lakes Artisans in pottery, hand-blown glass, wood works, sculptures, metal, paintings, photography, jewelry, fabric art, all natural candles, soaps and sundries, local musicians and literary artists' works, plus a pantry full of wonderful food confections produced locally.

Next enjoy lunch and a wine tasting at Arbor Hill Grapery and Winery. In the early 1900's Anna and Elmer Standish started a Naples grape-growing tradition that has spanned four (4) generations. Today's owners continue that tradition as an award-winning producer of wines and gourmet food products. In 1987 the farm winery opened to showcase the experimental grape varieties which have become a trademark of Arbor Hill. In 2011 they opened their restaurant, Brew & Brats, which serves Bristol Springs craft beer, locally made brats, and a full complement of house wines. Following lunch, you will depart for home with rest stops and a dinner stop (at your own expense) en route. **Meals: Breakfast, Lunch**

GENERAL LIMITATIONS AND EXCLUSIONS

Unless otherwise shown below, these exclusions apply to the Insured, the Insured's Traveling Companion, or Family Member scheduled and booked to travel with the Insured.

The following exclusion applies to the Trip Cancellation and Trip Interruption and Medical Expense:

We will not pay for any loss or expense caused due to, arising or resulting from a Pre-Existing Medical Condition, as defined in the plan.

The following exclusions apply to the Medical Expense benefits.

We will not pay for any loss or expense caused due to, arising or resulting from:

- 1. routine physical examinations or routine dental care;
- 2. traveling for the purpose or intent of securing medical treatment or advice;
- 3. Alcohol or substance abuse or treatment for the same;
- 4. Normal pregnancy (except Complications of Pregnancy) or childbirth, or elective abortion;
- 5. a Mental, Nervous or Psychological Condition or Disorder unless Hospitalized or Partially Hospitalized while the plan is in effect;
- 6. the Insured's participation in Adventure or Extreme Activities, riding or driving in races, or participation in speed or endurance competition or events, except as a spectator;
- 7. the Insured's participation in an organized athletic or sporting competition, contest, or stunt under contract in exchange for an agreed-upon salary or compensation. This does not include athletes participating in exchange for a scholarship or tuition.

The plan also contains exclusions specific to Baggage & Personal Effects and Baggage Delay.

In addition to any applicable benefit-specific exclusion, the following general exclusions apply to all losses and all benefits.

We will not pay for any loss or expense caused due to, arising or resulting from:

- 1. suicide, attempted suicide or any intentionally self-inflicted injury of the Insured, a Traveling Companion, Family Member, or Business Partner booked and scheduled to travel with the Insured, while sane or insane;
- 2. being under the influence of drugs or narcotics, unless administered upon the advice of a Physician as prescribed;
- 3. activities, losses, or claims involving or resulting from possession, production, processing, sale, or use of marijuana, illegal drugs, alcohol or substances are excluded from coverage;
- 4. war or act of war, including invasion, acts of foreign enemies, hostilities between nations (whether declared or undeclared), or civil war;
- 5. the commission of or attempt to commit a felony or being engaged in an illegal occupation by the Insured, a Traveling Companion, Family Member, or Business Partner;
- 6. directly or indirectly, the actual, alleged or threatened use, discharge, dispersal, seepage, migration, escape, release or exposure to any hazardous biological, chemical, nuclear radioactive weapon, device, material, gas, matter or contamination;
- 7. piloting or learning to pilot or acting as a member of the crew of any aircraft.

Pre-Existing Medical Condition Exclusion Waiver

The Pre-Existing Condition Exclusion will be waived if the protection plan is purchased within 14 days of the date the initial trip payment/deposit is received, and you are medically able and not disabled from travel at the time you pay for the plan, based on assessment of a physician.
