Stefanie Robey is an award-winning producer who joined Maryland Public Television in 2013 to work on the statewide public TV network's original series *Maryland Farm & Harvest*. She is currently the series producer for *Outdoors Maryland*.

Ms. Robey started her career at MPT in 2013 as an assistant producer helping bring about the premiere season of *Maryland Farm & Harvest*. She was promoted to segment producer for the series' second season, a role she maintained for five years. Ms. Robey produced upwards of 125 segments during her six seasons on the *Maryland Farm & Harvest* team, which took her everywhere from a ginseng farm in Appalachia to the oyster float operations of the Chesapeake to corn and soybean fields in every corner of the state.

In 2019, Ms. Robey transitioned to the role of producer. During this time, she produced the half-hour documentaries *Braddock's Road: A Legacy Unearthed* (2022), which details the archaeological excavation of an 18th-century military road, and *Discovering the Dove* (2023), which follows the design and build of a representation of the 17th-century sailing vessel, the Maryland Dove.

In 2023, Ms. Robey became the series producer for MPT's long-running original series *Outdoors Maryland*. The weekly series covers topics ranging from science-oriented environmental issues to segments about fascinating people, animals, and places across the state. She continues to produce documentaries and specials for the network, including the *2024 Chesapeake Bay Summit*, which analyzes the progress and pitfalls of bay restoration efforts.

Ms. Robey has earned 10 Emmy® Awards for her contributions to MPT series *Maryland Farm & Harvest*, *Outdoors Maryland*, *Discovering the Dove*, and the *Chesapeake Bay Summit*.

Beyond MPT, Ms. Robey has served in a freelance capacity as a food history writer for *Eaten Magazine*, podcast producer for *America's Test Kitchen*, and video editor for Lonely Planet TV.

Ms. Robey is a graduate of the University of Chicago, where she earned a bachelor's degree in anthropology.

Ms. Robey is an avid whitewater kayaker and hiker.
