Mr. Keegan joined Maryland Public Television as an executive producer in 2022. He is responsible for the production of MPT's lifestyle programming.

Mr. Keegan serves as executive producer for MPT's lifestyle programming, overseeing series such as *Chesapeake Collectibles*, *Destination Maryland*, and *Made in Maryland*. He has also served as the executive producer of several documentaries, including *Racing Rivals: Log Canoes of Chesapeake Bay*, *Resurrecting Poplar Island*, and, most recently, *Lifeblood: Chesapeake River Stories*.

During his time at MPT, he has earned three regional Emmy® Awards for *Made in Maryland*, *Destination Maryland*, and *Racing Rivals: Log Canoes of Chesapeake Bay*. In 2025, he earned a Communicator Award for *Old Dogs, New Tricks*, a comedic short produced to help viewers navigate and sign up for MPT Passport.

Prior to joining MPT, Mr. Keegan spent more than a decade with Warner Bros. Discovery. As a junior development executive, he managed Animal Planet's natural history content and its relationship with the BBC, and co-developed projects such as *Meerkat Manor*, *Mermaids: The Body Found*, and *Ocean's Deadliest* – Steve Irwin's final project. After transitioning to a production role, Mr. Keegan served as the supervising producer of hit series for Animal Planet and Discover Channel, including *Whale Wars*, *River Monsters*, *Pit Bulls and Parolees*, *North Woods Law*, *Too Cute*, *The Zoo*, several *Shark Week* specials, and co-created *Monster Week*, Animal Planet's annual programming block. He later joined investigation Discovery, overseeing in-house productions and developing new content drawn from Discovery's extensive library.

Following his tenure with Animal Planet, Mr. Keegan joined ID, Discovery's true-crime network. There, he was tasked with overseeing in-house productions, developing and producing content utilizing Discovery's extensive library of programming.

Originally from South Africa, Mr. Keegan relocated to the United States and attended Stevenson University, where he earned a bachelor's degree in film and video production.

He resides in Frederick with his wife, Rebecca O'Leary.
